### Remote control

Your solarium can be easily connected to a remote timing device by connecting the switched phase leads to the poles 3 and 5 to a 6 pole terminal, which is located on the right side, at the rear of the sliding rack. Remove and isolate the wires, connected to pole 3 and 5, which are needed for normal builtin-timer operation.

The connection of the remote switch is been shown in the following diagram. Use a cord type SJT or equivalent, with a maximum length of 25 feet.

A 2 or 3-minute "Lag Relay" after-cooling timer can also be connected to this terminal. This function is standard on most remote timing devices developed for use in the indoor tanning industry, or can be ordered from your authorized distributor as an easy-to-install module that fits onto the main contactor block, and is connected to pole no. 6 (red wire) there on.



In accordance with the maximum exposure limit of 30 minutes, the maximum running time of the remote timer should not exceed 30 minutes.

## **Important Notices**

- This solarium must be connected to a single phase 220 V 60 Hz power source.
- This solarium may only be used in a dry area, free of liquid spray or high humidity (below 70 %). The ambient temperature should not exceed 28 degrees Celsius (85 Degrees Fahrenheit), otherwise the surface temperature of the bench may become warm.
- To prevent overheating of the solarium, air intake vents and fan output areas must not be blocked.
- In the event of a ventilation fan failure, the solarium will operate warmer than normal, and should be shut down immediately to repair or replace the fan.
- Insure that the solarium is disconnected from the main power source when replacing lamps, starters, or acrylics, as well as during maintenance or cleaning.
- Electrical reparation may only be conducted by an authorized technician.
- The floor surface upon which the solarium is to be placed must have a support rating of at least 150 Lb. per square foot. If the surface rating cannot be officially confirmed, Dr. Kern USA must be contacted for further instructions prior to installation.

The solarium is operated with 220 V single phase.
 Only a power cord 3 x AWG 14 SJT or equivalent with a maximum length of 25 ft may be used.

### Important Things to know before Tanning

The irradiance output of this solarium has been calibrated for optimum effectiveness. Only the highest quality reflector lamps and acrylic sheets are employed to provide the best possible tanning performance at maximum UV-transmission levels. The "Te / Tm" (Time to Erythema relative to Time to Melanogenesis) has been precisely formulated and expressed in the recommended maximum exposure schedule (MED), which should never be exceeded.

In both commercial and residential application, the user should consult his or her physician about indoor sun tanning and its effects on their condition before using this solarium. Persons taking prescription medications must always take care that such substances do not increase the level of sensitivity to UV light, and may not tan if any warnings are issued by their respective manufacturers or the prescribing physician.

To the change of the metal-halogen-lamp, grasp only the flat ends and press them into the spring-loaded lampholders until properly secured. Make sure that the lamp envelope itself does not come in contact with your fingers. If this occurs, it should be cleaned with alcohol or spirits before use.

Facial lamps operate at very high temperatures and are cooled with fans in the cassettes. The lamp function is controlled additionally by a heat sensor. Should a fan stop working in any cassette the relay will turn the unit off automatically. The face tanner may not be used until an authorized service representative has repaired the problem. Automatic emergency shut offs of this type occur very infrequently. The cassette fans in the facial tanners normally do not fail.

Only factory - original components and spare parts may be used in servicing this solarium.

NEVER USE A FACE TANNER WITH BROKEN OR CRACKED FILTER GLASSES! Doing so will cause damage to eyes and facial skin.

### **Ventilation of the Solarium**

The ventilation system employed in your new solarium is the best possible. Cool air is drawn into vents at the base of the unit.

The strongest ventilation is at the bench acrylic area. With the strong air circulation, dust will be carried into the solarium and deposited onto its internal components. Any accumulation of dust will hinder the ventilation efficiency of the main fans. For this reason the solarium should be cleaned on a regular basis. Bear in mind that cool air can reduce the temperature of this machine better than warm air. Insure that the room in which the solarium is operated is sufficiently supplied with cool, fresh air.

### Cleaning the Solarium

Disconnect the power from the machine before each cleaning. Use only a moist cloth during cleaning.

# **Cleaning of the Acrylic Glass Sheets**

Use only material that contains no alcohol, amonia, or any other caustic substances. Use of these materials on the acrylic sheets will damage them, thereby voiding the warranty.


### **Electrical connection**

The main power input terminal is located inside the canopy under the canopy cover. For installation or replacement of the power cord, the top canopy cover must be removed.


This can be done by first removing the plastic end caps from the canopy and then removing the screws that run lengthwise across the back edge of the canopy cover.

Remove the canopy cover and feed the power cord through the strain relief inlet and over to the right hand side of the terminal strip. Connect the wires to the appropriate terminals (fig. 30) and replace the canopy cover.

Attention: Before replacing the canopy cover be sure that all three power wires (especially the ground wire) are connected properly and that the power cable is securely fastened by the strain relief.



For connection of the recliner to the canopy fit the plug of the connecting cable to the appliance inlet below the rear of the bench (fig. 31).



## **Instructions on Tanning**

Those persons who (1) do not tan in the natural sun or have type 1 skin (see warning label on unit), (2) are under 16 years of age - without written parental consent, and (3) are currently taking photo-sensitive medications or are afflicted with skin disorders or skin cancer, may not tan in this solarium.

The preset distance between the canopy and bench may not be altered for any reason.

Please read and observe the information outlined in the warning / danger labels and recommended exposure schedule.

Do not use this machine if any of the face tanning filter glasses is cracked or broken.

Overexposure of ultraviolet-radiation from the sun and this machine can cause sunburn, as well as damage to unprotected eyes.

Unusually frequent exposure to ultraviolet-irradiation from sunlight or this machine can cause premature aging of the skin and skin disorders.

High levels of UV-radiation can cause infections and damage the retina of the unprotected eye. Cataracts can also be caused by repeatedly exposing the unprotected eye to UV-radiation.

Special care should be taken to insure that medications taken or cosmetics worn during tanning are not UV-sensitive

As such the following precautions must be taken:

- Always use the included protective goggles;
- Remove all facial cosmetics and paba-based SPF before tanning in this machine;
- Do not tan in this machine if you are taking medications that may cause your system to become UV-sensitive.
   Ask your physician in advance of tanning;
- Always wait at least 48 hours between tanning session. Never more than once per day;
- Always observe the warning / danger labels as well as the exposure schedule;
- Always consult you physician should skin swelling, lesions, or "liver spots" appear on the skin.

## **Exposure schedule**

The recommended exposure schedule has been indelibly adhered to the front of the canopy, and should be followed explicitly.

The MED (Maximum Erythermal Dosage) or maximum tanning time may not be exceed.

### **Exposure distance**

The distance between the canopy and the bench may not be altered for any reason.

### **For Commercial Operators:**

- 1. No one under the age of 16 should be allowed to tan without the express, written consent of a parent or guardian.
- 2. The distance between the lamps and an individual tanning in this solarium has been preset, and may under no conditions be altered or lessened.
- UV radiation can cause damage to the skin and eyes. Insure that you and your staff have been properly trained by a state or provincially authorized educational organization to give adequate usage instructions to tanning customers.
- 4. Obey the contents of the danger and warning labels affixed to the solarium, and do not attempt to override the MED (maximum exposure dosage) session times.
- 5. Insure that all users of this solarium are given eye protection, of the type approved by your respective state's or province's health and / or radiological control agency, and insist that they be at all times when the unit's lamps are lighted.
- 6. Instruct all users to remove any make-up or facial cosmetics before using the solarium.
- 7. Be sure to not allow any individual to tan more than once during the course of a 24 hour period.
- 8. Do not allow any individual to tan should they appear physically sick, disoriented, under the in-

influence of alcohol, or display signs of swollen or infected skin. Insist that any such person goes immediately to their physician if they complain of injuries or burned skin before or after tanning.

- 9. Recommend to your customers that they apply a moisturizing lotion after tanning.
- 10. Make sure that there is enough room to move the parts of the machine into the cabin, and that there is sufficient space in the cabin itself for proper installation.

### After tanning

It is advisable to apply a moisturizing lotion on the skin after tanning.




Operating any 220 volt combination at voltage levels below 220 or above 240 constitutes an automatic nullification of the warranty, as it could cause damage to the unit's system.

Please insure that your electrican and / or installer reads this information prior to delivery and setup. Using a digital volt meter, he or she must first determine the exact line voltage being delivered to the receptacle. If the line voltage is not within the specified range, employment of a buck-boost transformer will be requested to regulate it. Please contact your authorized DR. KERN dealer for pricing and availability on buck-boost transformers.


# **Assembly of the Solarium**

The assembly begins with the bench. Lift the bench from the package and place it as shown in fig. 1, with the lamps pointed down toward the floor. Use a blanket or cloth underneath as protection. - Strips of cardboard from the packing may also be used.






On the underside, this now points upward, the pedestal is already secured at eight points. Take these screws out and use them to secure to the pedestal feet. - fig. 2




Be sure that screws are fixed solidly.

Secure the profile-strip included in the accessories, as in fig. 4, at toward the front of the feet. Use two 4.2 mm x 9.5 mm sheet metal screws to this.

Now press the sheet and the mounting profile slightly downward at several points along the rear side. When sufficient pressure is applied, the sheet and the mounting profile will snap into the groove along the rear side. See fig. 25.



The top acrylic is designed to be placed with tension into the canopy grooves. To remove, press inward in two places along the center of the sheet as in fig. 26, and pull it out from the front groove, as that edge will come free first.



Use the reverse method to replace. Slide the frontward edge of the sheet into its groove all the way in, and then place the other edge into its groove. To do this, the middle of the acrylic sheet must be depressed in two spots.



**NOTE:** The acrylic sheet in the canopy was first mounted in the factory as a flat sheet. After a while, the operation of the unit and its removal and replacement will cause the sheet to take on the form of the canopy.

The acrylic sheets should be regularly cleaned. Use only **solvent-free**, **non-caustic** materials.

**WARNING:** Only lamps listed on the warning / Danger label, or those with certified Compatibility Declarations (Refer to CFR 1040.21) should be used as replacements. These lamps can be purchased from your authorized distributor.


Turn each lamp so that one of the bipins can be seen through the lampholder groove. Take the lamp out carefully. Replace the new lamp in the reverse manner. Then turn the lamp 90 degrees in the direction to where the writing on the lamp is visible.


The starters should be changed with each lamp replacement. To do this, press inward on the starter and turn it until it comes free from its fixture. Replace the new starter in the reverse manner.

## **Servicing of the Face Tanner**

The facial lamp in the face tanner cassette should be replaced with regular frequency. To do this, loosen the screws on the outer frame of the face tanner, see fig. 28.

Slide the filter glasses out and clean them on a regular basis. Make sure that the filter glasses are replaced in the proper order, with the blue glass closest to the facial lamp, see fig. 29.






### **How to Operate**

If the solarium is used in a residence, without being connected to a commercial remote timer, it can be activated by turning the external timer knob to the desired tanning time.

After the tanning time on the display has ended, the lamps will automatically shut off.



### **Rocker Switch**

With the rocker switch you can choose the functions:

\* Face Tanner

**UV** Tanning Lamps

Depressing the switch marked "0" will also end the tanning session at any time; the timer will remain on and run down to "0".

### **Face Tanner**

The designated rocker switch can turn the face tanner on by depressing \*\*and off by depressing "0" during the tanning session.

Full tanning power is attained by the facial tan lamps after a warm-up time of approx. 3 minutes.

If switched off and immediately switched on again, the lamps do not light up again until after a time of approx. 3 minutes.



### **Replacing the Lamps and Starters**

The longevity of the fluorescent amps vary from manufacturer to manufacturer, but is usually between 500 and 800 hours of use.

Only authorized, original parts and factory components can be used in this machine; please make sure to have your model type and serial number available when ordering these from your DR. KERN distributor.




### Disconnect the solarium before performing any work on it. The acrylic sheet in the canopy and bench must be removed to replace the lamps and starters.


The acrylic sheet in the recliner is held in place in a groove running along the front and in a mounting profile along the rear longitudinal side. The mounting profile is clipped together with the sheet into the rear longitudinal side. To remove the acrylic sheet, the profile must be pressed slightly downward and pulled forward with uniform pressure. See fig. 23. The acrylic shield is then released along the rear side and can be removed from the recliner.


**NOTE:** Acrylic glass expands through heating, so the sheets should only be removed in a cool or cold state.

To replace the acrylic sheet, inserted it into the groove along the front side and set it down on the supports in the recliner. See fig. 24.











Situate the top edge of the front pedestal cover panel into the groove underneath the forward bench rail. Be sure that the side with the lightly grainy surface faces toward the outside. Press the middle of the front pedestal panel toward the inside until it snaps into place.

The panel is stong enough situated in this manner as to not require being screwed in.






Secure the outer sides of the pedestal covers toward the foot end. Again, make sure that the lightly grainy surface on the panel is toward the outside.


Take 3 ea. of the  $4.2 \text{ mm} \times 9.5 \text{mm}$  sheet metal screws from the accessories-bag and use them to secure the panels.






And thats all you need to put the pedestal together. The bench can now be situated onto the intended securing points on the pedestal. - fig. 9

As prepration of mounting the canopy, loosen the upper 2 top securing screws at both of the right and left sides on the side panels . Use a big screwdriver or a coin to do this. - fig. 10




After loosening the screw, press the side panel somewhat toward the outside. With the side panel remaining in that position, a screwdriver could become jammed or stuck therein. See fig. 11.




# **Assembly and Mounting of the Canopy**


The last setup step on the bench was the loosening of the right and left side panels, which caused the protection plates to become free. These protection-plates cover the openings into which the canopy, with its rotating housings at either end, will be placed. Loosen the securing screws on the protection plates so that they can be turned away from the opening in the canopy to free them for mounting. See fig. 12.



Two people may now lift the canopy out of its package and place both ends so that they can slide into the groove with the mouthlike opening. See fig. 12a.



With one person holding the canopy securely at the front, secure the canopy into the rotating housings. To this you must first place both protection-plates so that the big opening on the protection-plate grasps over rotating housings. See fig. 13.



After you have placed both protection-plates at the left and right rotating housings, secure their respective securing screws with the enclosed SW 10 wrench.


Please oil the bearing before assembling the canopy. Use any regular machine oil or vehicle grease.


After the canopy has been properly and securely mounted, it can be let down onto the bench. Replace the side cover panels in the manner in which they were delivered.

# **Mounting the Gas Spring**

At the gas springs, which are already mounted at the protection plates, safety washers are fixed at the ball-joint connector. These safety washers have to be removed. See fig. 14.

To insure proper securing of the gas spring, the canopy must be raised high enough so that the upper ball-joint connector can be snapped onto the ball-joint on the canopy. Press the ball-joint connector onto the ball-joint as shown in fig. 15. Test the installation by moving the canopy up and down to check for easy movement.





**NOTE!** The ball-joint connectors have been lubricated at the factory with a special grease, which may not be removed.

Before depressing the canopy downward, check the mounting of the gas springs and replace the safety washers on the ball-joint connectors to hold the ball-joints in place therein. **Replacement of the safety washers is very important; the canopy may not be moved without this first having been done.** 

Move the canopy up and down a few times. You will notice that when the canopy is completely raised, the gas spring will move upwards. As the canopy is moved downward, a lighter resistance will be noticeable than at lower levels.

Be advised, however, that slight variations in resistance can occur. A lower or higher force variation in the gas spring can influence the difficulty or ease with which the canopy can be moved.







# **Body Fans**

The blue dream CX Series of Solaria are produced standard with one body fan.

The excellent CX Series are available with an optional body fan. The article number of the body fan is 919260.



Remove the body fan by its securing plate as in fig. 19. Pull it outward by the side panel and then upward. Then connect the 3-pole plug / receptacle from the body fan to the solarium.



The long holes of the securing plate should be alligned with holes on the side panel containing the screws which were removed earlier. Use those screw to secure the body fan to the solarium.

The body fan can be turned on or off with the designated rocker switch on the control panel.
